





Site plan of Black Mesa Golf Course depicting "clear areas" from all tees, 15 degrees either side of tee marker, 200 yards from the tee boxes.







Accident scene, hole #2 at Black Mesa.



At the access point to the first 1st hole and the 10th hole there should be a warning sign telling • golfers of the danger of snakes on the property (example: yellow/black sign). Expert witnessed rattlesnake on day of his site visit (red arrow).



• Close up of rattlesnake seen by expert on site visit.





 Expert, Ed Wankel observed another rattlesnake on his way to the 2nd hole shortly after he left the clubhouse. This large rattlesnake was in close proximity to the cart path.





 As photo shows this rattlesnake is working his way through the natural grasses at Black Mesa.



• Expert observed only six of these rattlesnakes habitat signs on the entire golf course. This small sign not only blends into the landscape but also gives no warning to the danger.





 The plaintiff was attacked by a local rattlesnake a short distance from the 2nd tee box while helping her husband find his errant tee shot. At the time of the attack there was no warning sign about the danger of rattlesnakes in this area.

• This sign was placed near the location of the rattlesnake attack sometime after the incident occurred, as per testimony of an eye witness who was playing golf with the plaintiff on the day of the incident.





• Typical rough area at Black Mesa golf course.



• This is a view of the 2nd hole fairway from the white tee markers. The accident happened to the left of the cart path.



• 2nd hole fairway where an extensive rough area is visible on the right side of this fairway.



• View of second tee where Mr. Seeds hit his errant golf shot into the rough where plaintiff was attacked. No warning signs.

• A view from the 2nd tee where Mr. Seeds hit his errant shot to the left of the tee in the extensive rough area. This is part of the rattlesnake habitat, which dominates the Black Mesa golf course property.



• Location of the 4th hole at Black Mesa, another possible location for a warning sign.



* Expert observed a golfer walking out of the rough to the right of the cart path, who was searching for his errant golf shot. Had there been a sign as appears from this photo, this golfer may have thought twice about walking in this area.



• View of extensive rough area at hole #8.





• At hole #8, a challenging par 3 is 238 yards to the green. There is a better than fifty percent chance that a golfer's ball will land in the rough on this hole.

• There is an extensive rough area surrounding the 8th green and there is no warning sign about the dangers of rattlesnakes.





• As the picture shows, there is considerable rough area to navigate from yet another tee box at black mesa.
